Home Learning Expectations

- ▶ **Home Learning - set on Wednesdays.** Tasks will be uploaded to **Google Classroom** and the majority will be on maths.co.uk or SPAG.com.
- ▶ During the year, children will also be expected to read for pleasure regularly and practise spellings and times tables .
- ▶ **Spelling** - A word list with the week's spelling pattern will be put in handbooks on Mondays, which we will learn and practice in class, and children should learn these at home too. **In Year 6 we will be doing an informal spelling test every Friday.**
- ▶ **Reading-** children are expected to read 5 times a week at home and handbooks should be filled out and signed to show this. Comments are encouraged.
- ▶ Children also have access to **Times-Tables Rockstars** - an online platform for children to complete their tables and compete against each other.



Google Classroom

- ▶ Your children need to ensure they are logged into their own Google account.
- ▶ E.g. 22a.Williams@foxhillsjuniorschool.co.uk
- ▶ Password is foxhills (all lowercase)
- ▶ Their account should already be linked to their Classroom so will not need to class code.

PE day - Monday and Thursday

- ▶ Pupils will have a designated PE session twice a week and daily opportunities for physical exercise.
- ▶ We encourage children to wear their PE kits to school on the day of their PE lesson.
- ▶ Pupils should wear appropriate PE kit (t-shirt with house colour, sweatshirt/hoodie with school logo, plain shorts, black/navy leggings, black/navy socks).
- ▶ Children with long hair must have it tied back and earrings should either be taken out prior to the school day or be covered with tape.
- ▶ Please label all PE kit including hoodies.

Uniform

- Please ensure your pupil has the correct uniform (this can be ordered through the school office).
- **Please label your child's uniform with their name and class.**
- Long hair should be tied up for health and safety reasons.
- Children should wear school shoes, not trainers.
- No nail varnish.
- A backpack or book bag, lunch box, water bottle.
- Children should not wear jewellery other than earrings.








School Values Points

When you demonstrate the characteristics of our learning values: Care, Learn, Engage, Achieve and Reflect, you will be awarded a value point using the grids below. When you complete a row, you will receive a learning value certificate (every time you achieve ten points).

If you manage to fill one row of each value (therefore achieving at least 50 points across the range of values) your parents/carers will be invited in to school for a celebration assembly, which will make you a Values Champion for your year group. A Values Champion means you have demonstrated sufficient understanding of the characteristics of the learning monsters, in your year group. In addition to a certificate, you will also receive a badge to wear on your uniform.

If you manage to complete every row before the end of the year (therefore achieving 100 points), your parents will be invited in again to celebrate you becoming a Values Ambassador. A Values Ambassador means you have fully mastered the learning values for the year group and can act as a role model for others. You will be given a special badge to wear on your uniform.
